Discover Burgundy

Located in the eastern part of France, south of Paris and north of Lyon, Burgundy is one of the world's most famous wine regions.

1,247 Climats extend from Dijon to Mâcon, and among them are some of the most famous names from the world of wine: Chambertin, Chambolle-Musigny, Clos de Vougeot, and our own Clos Marey-Monge. Each Climat has its own story – soil type, gradient, altitude, sun exposure, and winemaking techniques – which give its wines their distinct character. Two Climats situated just meters apart, within the same appellation and growing the same grape variety can produce two uniquely different wines.

When visiting from Paris, the next stop south from Beaune is Pommard, located close to the center of the Côte d'Or. With its mosaic of celebrated sun-soaked south-east facing vineyards and captivating sights, smells and sounds all year round, the village of Pommard is surrounded by ageless, timeless beauty. At its heart is Château de Pommard.

Burgundy Vintages

Have you ever wondered why the vintage appears on the label of a wine? Alongside terroir, grape variety, and human intervention, weather conditions specific to each winegrowing region and vineyard combine to create unique cuvées, each with its own qualities and aging potential.

This Spring 2023, we will be releasing our Famille Carabello-Baum 2021 vintage. As for every winery in Burgundy, this is going to be a very rare, exclusive vintage with limited stocks, so be sure to get in touch with one of our Wine Advisors to secure your order.



2013

A wet and cold spring, June hail and a stormy summer resulted in low yields. Grapes were late to ripen with harvest at the end of September. Fruity and mineral white wines. Earthy and rounded red wines.



2014

A very wet summer followed June hail decreasing grape quantities. Dry and windy conditions in September preceded a late harvest in the last two weeks of September. Smooth and refreshing whites. Elegant and earthy reds.



2015

Typical spring weather and a very hot, dry summer created superb conditions. Harvest happened in early September, but low vine sugar delivered limited yields. Chardonnays are rich and ample, Pinot Noirs are colorful, balanced, and fruit forward.



2016

A hot, dry summer preceded by a cold and wet spring with black frost in late April. Yields were the lowest of the past two decades. Harvest took place in mid-September. Elegant and soft whites. Complex, fresh reds with good acidity.



2017

Sunny spring and summer with perfectly ripe grapes harvested the first two weeks of September resulting in the best yields in a decade. Balanced, aromatic Chardonnays. Very expressive and harmonious Pinot Noirs.



2018

Beautiful spring weather preceded a sweltering, dry summer. Good yields, with grapes harvested early at the end of August and beginning of September. A promising vintage for whites and reds.



2019

Spring was punctuated by cold periods with several frosts and a difficult flowering. Summer was hot and dry. Harvest in mid-September with low yields. Rich, well-balanced whites and delicious reds with a pleasant freshness.



2020

A vintage marked by an unusually rapid cycle with sunny, dry weather. Harvest at the end of August with heterogeneous yields. The white wines are fruity with a beautiful aromatic complexity. The reds are delicious with concentrated character.



2021

A severe frost in April, followed by a rainy summer. Harvest in mid-September with limited yields. A delicate, refined vintage. The whites are complex and aromatic. The reds are fruity and elegant.



2022

Generous and qualitative vintage, despite frost episodes in April and a very hot summer. Harvest at the end of August. Very good yields. Chardonnays are aromatic, with texture and a fresh finish. Pinot Noirs display crunchy red fruits and a good tannic structure.





BOURGOGNE PINOT NOIR 2021

Located on the plain that faces the Clos Marey-Monge, the soils of Pommard are a great match for the region's native red grape. The clay-rich soils of the Côte de Beaune are the cradle of our Bourgogne Pinot Noir, a balanced and silky wine that expresses the essence of Burgundy's iconic grape variety.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby

Nose: Fresh and floral notes

Mouth: Intense blackcurrant bud aromas. Acidulous and peppery finish.



BOURGOGNE CHARDONNAY 2021

The limestone-rich soils of the Côte de Beaune are perfect for producing our Bourgogne Chardonnay, a well-balanced, fruity & fresh wine showing the potential of the Chardonnay grape. The most approachable appellation of Burgundy embodies the essence of the region's native white grape. We see it as a welcoming entry to all the Villages, Premiers Crus and Grands Crus the region's vineyards have to offer.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow

Nose: Floral aromas of linden and Acacia.

Mouth: Fresh and generous with notes of citrus. Round and persistent finish.





ALOXE-CORTON
2021

Aloxe-Corton is located on stony slopes at the foot of the Hill of Corton, allowing the vines to absorb sunlight all day long. The vineyard's iron-rich soils give birth to a complex and silky Pinot Noir.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby
Nose: Refreshing and floral, with notes of peony and cherry.
Mouth: Refined and balanced with raspberry & blackcurrant. Slightly tangy finish.



CHAMBOLLE-MUSIGNY
2021

Now to 10 years

Chambolle-Musigny is rooted in the shallow clay and limestone soils on the easterly slopes of the Côte de Nuits, rising between 250 and 300 meters above sea level. Our Pinot Noir grown here is complex with soft tannins and a long finish. Once an adjunct to the Cîteaux Abbey, the vineyard gave its name to the village of Chambolle-Musigny, like 11 other climats throughout the Côte d'Or.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby
Nose: Complex aromatic bouquet of black fruits, cherry and laurel.
Mouth: Supple yet melted tannins. Notes of black cherry on the lengthy finish.



MARANGES PREMIER CRU “LE CLOS DES LOYÈRES” 2021

Located in the very south of the Côte de Beaune, the marly-clay and limestone-rich soils of the Maranges “Le Clos des Loyères” vineyard produce a Pinot Noir bursting with freshness, energy and length. Created in 1988, the Maranges appellation includes three villages – Cheilly-lès-Maranges, Dezize-lès-Maranges, and Sampigny-lès-Maranges – and has seven Premiers Crus.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Dark Ruby

Nose: Aromas of raspberry and cherry. Subtle spicy notes.

Mouth: Same flavors. Long and mineral finish.



NUITS-SAINT-GEORGES 2021

The Nuits-Saint-Georges appellation consists of two parts. In the north, its soils are rich in alluvial deposits from the Meuzin Valley. In the south, the silty soils come from the Vallerots Valley. The top of the hill has exposed limestone rocks. Born from vines on a clay-rich plot, our Nuits-Saint-Georges is at once intense and complex.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep Ruby

Nose: Intense aromas of blackcurrant and violet.

Mouth: Generous with velvety tannins. Fresh and sapid finish.

CHASSAGNE-MONTRACHET
2021

Now to 7 years

Rising between 220 to 325 meters above sea level, the soils composed of marl, clay, limestone & pebbles in the southern end of the Côte de Beaune produce this Chassagne-Montrachet, a fresh and full-bodied Chardonnay showing the finest expression of the terroir.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Straw-Gold

Nose: Buttery with aromas of Acacia and hawthorn.

Mouth: Fresh with dried fruits, honey and white pepper. Persistent and refreshing finish.

SAVIGNY-LES-BEAUNE
2021

Between the hills of Corton & Beaune, Savigny-Les-Beaune is a very old wine village. Historically, the vineyard belonged to the Dukes of Burgundy and neighboring abbeys. Its limestone-rich soils produce fresh and floral Chardonnay, a gorgeous representation of this unique terroir.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow

Nose: Fresh and elegant with floral notes and a light toasty touch.

Mouth: Straightforward with notes of pear and apricot.





LADOIX PREMIER CRU "LES GRÉCHONS"
2021

Now to 10 years

Ladoix is the last vineyard in northern Côte de Beaune before entering the Côte de Nuits. "Les Gréchons" is one of the highest plots positioned on the steep slopes of the Hill of Corton, once home to ancient quarries. Sedimentary, fossil-rich soils produce an intense and mineral Chardonnay that can be enjoyed today or aged for years.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Gold

Nose: Buttery notes along with a touch of Acacia.

Mouth: Powerful and firm with a persistent roundness and notes of quince and pear. Intense mineral finish.



NUITS-SAINT-GEORGES PREMIER CRU "AUX MURGERS"
2021

DRINKABILITY
Now to 15 years

"Aux Murgers", meaning a "pile of stones", is one of the most northerly Premiers Crus of the Nuits-Saint-Georges appellation. Thanks to its proximity to the nearby prestigious village of Vosne-Romanée, this marl and limestone-rich vineyard produces powerful and seductive wines.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep Ruby

Nose: Notes of cherry and other red fruits, highlighted by delicate spices.

Mouth: Generous with notes of blackcurrant bud and clove. Long-lasting yet subtle finish.



VOUGEOT PREMIER CRU "LES PETITS VOUGEOTS" 2021

Now to 15 years

Surrounded by two prestigious Grands Crus, "Les Petits Vougeots" is a tiny and highly sought-after vineyard in the Côte de Nuits and an excellent representation of the outstanding quality of the Vougeot appellation. Its marl and limestone-rich soils lend delicacy and depth to the wine.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense Ruby

Nose: Wild strawberry and blackberry, lightly toasted notes of vanilla.

Mouth: Harmonious and elegant, with integrated tannins. Persistent finish.



CLOS DE VOUGEOT GRAND CRU 2021

Now to 20 years

Clos de Vougeot has been famous since its construction by monks in the 11th century. Some say that you can taste a part of Burgundy's history in a glass of this wine which is rich, intense and complex, thanks to an exceptional terroir composed of limestone and marl.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep Ruby

Nose: Smoky notes and blackcurrant aromas.

Mouth: Generous with blackcurrant and liquorice notes. Rich and highly mineral finish.
